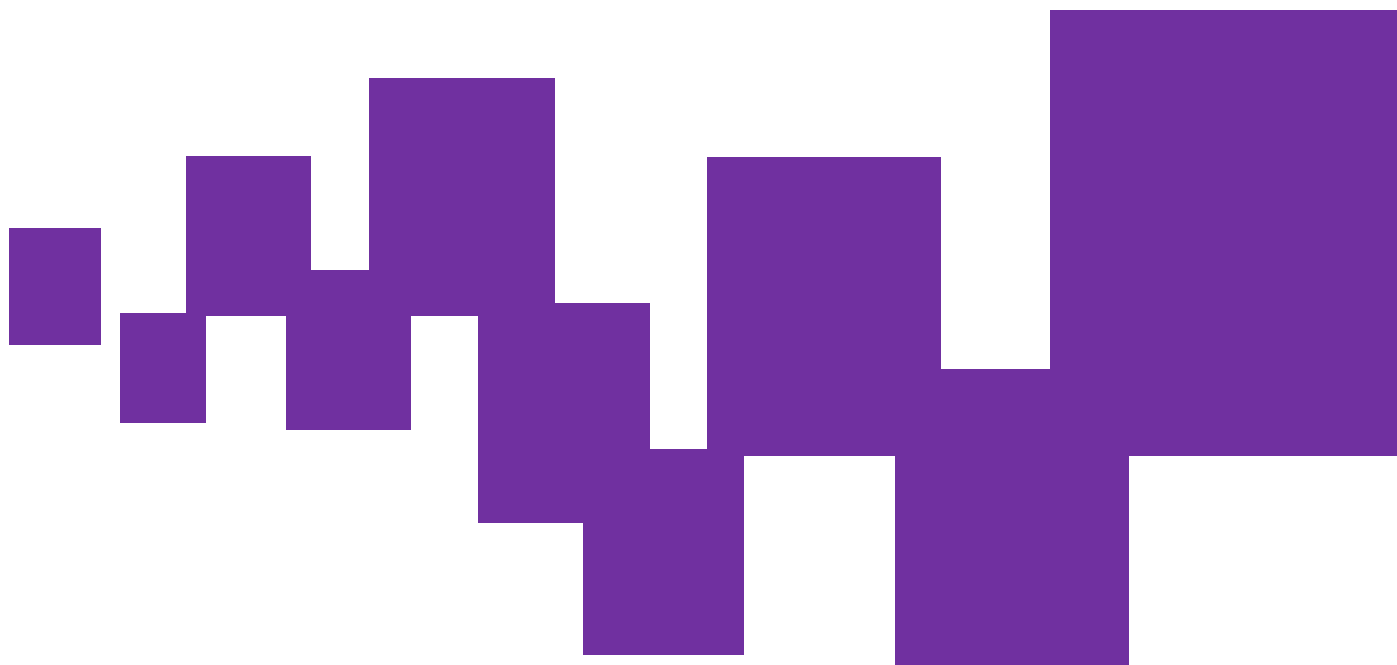

INTRODUCTION

Dual Enrollment is a **16 year** joint partnership with Montgomery College (MC) that allows Wootton High School to provide the opportunity for your child to enroll at MC and earn transferable college credits. Additionally, the Dual Enrollment program tremendously enhances your child's college admissions profile.

CLASSES

All classes MC has to offer are available for students to enroll. Classes are held during the regular school day, after school and online. Each class, taught by a college professor, is one semester long. Most classes meet three times a week; Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The classes in the place of a student's 2nd and 3rd period high school class are only at USG. **Classes taken on MC's campus will have different meeting times & dates.**

TRANSCRIPTS

When enrolled in the Dual Enrollment program, your child will receive an official college transcript in addition to an official high school transcript.

REQUIREMENTS

The requirements to enroll in the Dual Enrollment program are:

- ✚ GPA of 2.5 or higher (**under 2.5 can appeal for consideration**)
- ✚ High School and Montgomery College written approval.
